2 Background:

- 3 Whereas, the state of Minnesota is considering the adoption of a single administrator for the purposes of
- managing the dental treatment for Minnesota Health Care Program enrollees, which includes Minnesota's
 Medicaid and Minnesota Care programs, and
- Whereas, Minnesota law¹ requires dental provider reimbursement rates under a single administrator to be
 the minimum allowable rates, currently used by Fee For Service, and
- 8 Whereas, some managed care plans and county-based purchasing plans reimburse providers at rates 9 higher than Fee For Service Rates, and
- 10 Whereas, the Minnesota Dental Association submitted on March 14, 2024, a response to a Request for
- 11 Information (RFI) issued by the Minnesota Department of Human Services regarding the potential
- 12 transition to a single administrator for dental services under Minnesota Health Care Programs.
- ¹ Minnesota Statutes 256B.0371, subdivision 3(c) states "dental administrator payments to contracted dental providers must be at the rates established under sections 256B.76 and 256L.11."

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- Resolved, that the Minnesota Dental Association believes that a single administrator or any new system
 of administration for dental services provided under Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) must
 concurrently provide adequate and reasonable reimbursement rates.
